Sustainability Corner

From Policy to Projects to Performance: Why the 2026 Decarbonization Conference Matters in Dallas

ASHRAE holds its sixth Building Decarbonization Conference September 23-25 in Seattle, and the theme this year is “Decarbonization That Delivers: From Policy to Projects to Performance.” For a North Texas audience, that middle-to-right side of the phrase is where the value sits.

The mandate question

Much of the national decarbonization conversation is organized around building performance standards; the ordinances now in force in cities like Seattle, Denver, and Washington, D.C., that set enforceable energy or emissions targets on existing buildings. Texas has no equivalent, and state law limits what municipalities can require. It would be easy for a Dallas engineer to read the program and conclude the content is written for somebody else.

That reading misses the point. The projects presented at this conference are almost entirely driven by owner economics: utility incentive capture, tax credit and capital-stacking strategies, retrocommissioning payback, deferred capital planning, and the operating cost exposure that comes with an increasingly stressed grid. Those drivers are as real in Dallas as they are in Seattle. The mandate is what forces the conversation elsewhere; here, the business case has to carry it alone. That makes the financial and delivery content on this program more useful to us, not less.

Building types that look like ours

The conference organizes much of its content around building archetypes, and the list reads like an inventory of DFW's growth: data centers, airports and transportation hubs, hospitals, laboratories, higher education campuses, K-12 districts, and municipal portfolios. North Texas is actively building or renovating in every one of those categories. Session on data center waste heat recovery, district energy, portfolio route-to-implementation strategy, and whole life carbon and life-cycle cost analysis map onto work our members are scoping right now.

Two keynotes worth noting: Stet Sanborn of SmithGroup will address how to scale decarbonization impact during a period of federal rollbacks and rising energy costs; a framing that will land with anyone who has watched a project's incentive assumptions change mid-design. Erin McConahey of Arup argues that the industry's problem is not carbon measurement but carbon-informed design, drawing on an analysis of more than 1,000 buildings. A keynote panel of state and city officials will cover how much BPS policy is being coordinated across jurisdictions, which is worth understanding even in a state that has not adopted it, since many of our clients own buildings in states that have.

Practical Details

Registration is \$775 for members and \$875 for non-members, with student registration at \$100 and one-day rates available on-site. The full technical program and schedule are posted on the conference page at [ashrae.org](https://www.ashrae.org). If cost or travel puts the conference out of reach this year, the committee is interested in doing a chapter debrief for members who do attend. If you are going, let us know, we would like to bring what you learn back to the chapter.

Refrigeration Corner

HVAC Dehumidification: Why Hot Gas Reheat Doesn't Dehumidify

Dehumidification is often misunderstood because several HVAC processes happen at the same time. One common misconception is that adding hot gas reheat causes an HVAC system to dehumidify when in reality, it doesn't. Hot gas reheat can be an important part of a dehumidification system, but its purpose is to control the supply-air temperature *after* moisture has already been improved.

The fundamental principle of HVAC dehumidification is simple: to remove moisture from air, you must cool the air below its dew point. Dew point is the temperature at which air becomes saturated with water vapor. When humid air meets a surface colder than its dew point, water vapor condenses into liquid water. In a Direct Expansion air-conditioning system, such as a rooftop unit, the evaporator coil provides that cold surface. As air passes over the coil, it is cooled below its dew point, and moisture condenses on the coil before draining away.

For example, imagine entering air at 75F with a 60F dew point. If the evaporator coil is cold enough to produce 49F leaving air with a 48F dew point, moisture has been removed from the air. The problem is that 49F supply air may be too cold for the space. This is where hot gas reheat becomes useful. The system can continue operating the evaporator at conditions that provide the necessary latent cooling, then use hot gas reheat to raise the supply-air temperature to something more appropriate, such as 65F.

The important distinction is that evaporator removes the moisture; the reheat coil only adds sensible heat back to the air. Hot gas reheat doesn't create dehumidification. It allows the system to dehumidify without overcooling the space.

When evaluating a dehumidification system, don't simply ask whether it has hot gas reheat. Instead, ask: where is the moisture being removed?

The Bottom Line

If you're designing a space where humidity control is a priority or replacing a unit that serves a critical space like this, remember that hot gas reheat does not automatically qualify equipment to serve as humidity control. The refrigeration circuit and evaporator coil must be sized to produce a low enough coil temperature, even on design dehumidification days, to remove the moisture from the air. If a unit is sized to produce that low leaving coil temperature only on the worst dry bulb conditions, you could lose control of the space humidity on high humidity days, especially here in Texas where we can see extreme humidity in addition to our high ambient temperature. Hot gas reheat comes afterward. It allows the system to remove moisture while keeping the final supply-air temperature from becoming unnecessarily cold.

Quickbooks Incoming!

Following the website update, Quickbooks and StarChapter are now integrated for chapter transaction tracking. The Finance Committee is currently configuring Quickbooks to serve as a central financial platform for chapter funds, budgeting, and transaction tracking.

This represents a significant modernization of our treasury operations as we transition away from Excel-based budgeting and towards centralized Quickbooks budgeting and reporting. As the system is rolled out, BoG members, chairs, and committees will have access to several new capabilities, including:

- Reimbursement logging and tracking through Quickbooks: rather than relying on email chains, reimbursement requests will be submitted and tracked through Quickbooks, helping ensure requests are not overlooked and members are reimbursed in a timely manner.
- Open books and live account tracking: leadership will have improved visibility into current income, expenses, and transaction history.
